Background.

Unfortunately, due to recent changes in the JTC 1 procedures, a change I was unaware of until just today, we cannot vote to "stabilize" a standard until at least one review cycle has passed after the last modification to the standard. The relevant text is the following:

15.6.1 At least one review cycle must pass after the last modification to an existing standard before it can be recommended for stabilization by the owning Subcommittee or other standards owning body within JTC 1.

This circumstance has not yet occurred for ISO/IEC 15292:2001.

So we must deal with this one yet again. Our CS1 meeting result to stabilize ISO/IEC 15292:2001 as one of three standards we reviewed as part of the 2006 systematic review of standards, is not an available option at this point.

The CS1 August meeting agenda item was

5.7.2.3 For Action – Confirm, Revise, Withdraw or Stabilize ISO/IEC 15292:2001 Information technology - Security techniques - Protection Profile registration procedures
